

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



PRESENTAZIONE DEL CONGRESSO

Quest'anno la XVII edizione del congresso S.I.C.S.S.O. si terrà a **Paestum**, stessa location del 2014, molto apprezzata per la particolare accoglienza riservataci dagli operatori locali, molti dei quali sono stati miei compagni di scuola.

Il titolo dell'edizione 2018 “**Let's discuss again... clinical cases**” riassume l'obiettivo di tornare a dare spazio alle tanto apprezzate sessioni cliniche che S.I.C.S.S.O. ha organizzato in precedenza.

Nelle ultime edizioni era stato dato risalto alla chirurgia in diretta soprattutto per soddisfare il crescente interesse nella DMEK, tecnica chirurgica prepotentemente subentrata nella nostra pratica.

Quest'anno invece abbiamo deciso di sacrificare la chirurgia in diretta e di concentrarci su “chi è sul campo” tutti i giorni, negli ambulatori e in pronto soccorso, al fine di consentire la verifica dei propri protocolli operativi, anche in relazione a quanto richiesto dalle nuove normative in tema di linee guida, e dei conseguenti risvolti medico legali.

La necessità di convergere sulle diagnosi, e quindi sulle conseguenti terapie, è sempre il problema più vivo in tema di “cornea e superficie oculare”. In primis, in merito alle infezioni corneali, patologie dai risvolti a volte drammatici, l'avere comportamenti consoni e condivisi resta ancora un obiettivo da raggiungere.

Il cuore del congresso nella Sala Plenaria sarà quindi la **discussione di casi clinici**, sia con il coinvolgimento dell'audience attraverso il televoto, che attraverso la **“valutazione in diretta del paziente”** nei casi di difficile interpretazione, punto di forza del congresso S.I.C.S.S.O. grazie alla presenza dei principali Opinion Leaders provenienti da tutto il mondo.

Il tema chirurgico avrà comunque spazio grazie all'aumento del numero di **wet-labs su bulbi e tessuti forniti dalle Banche degli Occhi**. Chi vuole iniziare ad approcciarsi alla DMEK e alle altre tecniche chirurgiche avrà la possibilità di confrontarsi con docenti di eccezionale bravura, come quelli di quest'anno.

Sono stati anche organizzati **Corsi in Italiano**, con **limitato numero di partecipanti** (30 persone), per approfondire meglio e chiarire dubbi su vari temi che nella Sala Plenaria non avrebbero adeguato spazio.

Anche quest'anno sono state assegnate due **Medal Lectures** a **Kathryn Colby** e **Sadeer Hannush**, colleghi straordinari, da sempre “amici S.I.C.S.S.O.”

Verranno inoltre **premiati tre partecipanti "under 40"** per la migliore innovation, il miglior poster ed il poster più originale.

Una grande novità sarà la presentazione del **cambio di statuto di S.I.C.S.S.O.**, durante la sessione Medal Lectures, che aprirà la strada al coinvolgimento della nostra Società anche in ambito internazionale.

Fin dalla prima edizione del congresso annuale la S.I.C.S.S.O. ha ospitato Speakers internazionali e, nelle edizioni più recenti, dopo aver “gemmato” Eucornea, la presenza di partecipanti stranieri provenienti da nazioni in crescita è oramai la regola.

Negli ultimi quindici anni, la gestione delle patologie corneali ha registrato un'incredibile evoluzione innovativa in termini di mini-invasività, con i trapianti lamellari, e di prevenzione e contenimento delle patologie con l'utilizzo di sofisticate apparecchiature diagnostiche e con trattamenti conservativi come il crosslinking. S.I.C.S.S.O. ha sempre promosso la divulgazione di tutte queste innovazioni, consentendo in Italia i primi trapianti di limbus e di tessuto amniotico, e contribuendo alla diffusione dei trapianti di cornea lamellari (DALK, DSAEK, DMEK).

Nonostante l'incredibile evoluzione di diagnosi e trattamento delle patologie corneali, la cecità corneale nel mondo resta un problema immenso, e nella maggior parte delle nazioni, anche economicamente evolute, tutte queste nuove tecniche chirurgiche non sono ancora approdate. Il numero di interventi e tessuti necessari è stimato in circa 70 volte l'attuale.

S.I.C.S.S.O. ha un progetto molto ambizioso e la sua nuova Mission “Cornea Transplant Foundation for Developing Countries” sarà presentata in dettaglio durante la sessione Medal Lectures, Venerdì alle 12.15 in Sala Plenaria.

CONGRESS PRESENTATION

This year the XVII S.I.C.S.S.O. Congress edition will be held in Paestum as in 2014. This location is very much appreciated for the special reception given by local operators, many of whom were my classmates when I was a child.

The title of the 2018 edition "**Let's discuss again... clinical cases**" summarizes the aim to give space again to the much appreciated clinical sessions that S.I.C.S.S.O. has organized previously.

In recent editions, live surgery was emphasized especially to meet the growing interest in DMEK, a surgical technique that overwhelmingly took over our practice. This year, we decided to sacrifice the live surgery and to focus on "who is on the field" every day, in clinics and in the emergency room, in order to allow verification of protocols, guidelines and the resulting legal implications.

The need to converge on the diagnosis and on the consequent therapies is always the most vivid problem in terms of "cornea and ocular surface diseases". Firstly, having appropriate and common behaviors in the management of corneal infections, which can have dramatic consequences, is still a goal to be achieved.

Therefore, the heart of the congress in the Main Room will be the **discussion of clinical cases**, either involving the audience through televoting, either through the "**live patient evaluations**" in challenging cases. This is a key aspect of the S.I.C.S.S.O. congress, which is made possible thanks to the presence of Opinion Leaders from all over the world sharing their knowledge.

Surgery will still have space thanks to the increase in the number of **wet-labs on bulbs and tissues provided by the Eye Banks**. Who wants to start approaching the DMEK and other surgical techniques will have the opportunity to learn from teachers of exceptional skills, such as those of this year.

Courses in Italian language will be also available, with a limited number of participants (30 people), to further deepen and clarify doubts on various topics that would not have adequate space in the Main Room.

This year two **Medal Lectures** have been awarded to **Kathryn Colby** and **Sadeer Hannush**, extraordinary colleagues, who have always been "S.I.C.S.S.O. friends".

Three "under 40" ophthalmologists will be awarded for the best innovation, the best poster and the most original poster.



A great news will be the presentation of the **modification of the S.I.C.S.S.O. bylaw**, which will give the way for the involvement of our society in the international field. International Speakers have been hosted since the first edition of the S.I.C.S.S.O. annual conference and, in more recent editions, after "gemmated" Eucornea, the presence of foreign participants from growing nations is now the rule.

In the last fifteen years, the management of corneal diseases has recorded an amazing evolution in terms of minimally invasive surgery tanks to lamellar keratoplasties, and in terms of disease prevention and containment with the use of sophisticated diagnostic equipment and conservative treatments such as crosslinking. S.I.C.S.S.O. has always promoted the diffusion of all these innovations, making happen the first limbal stem cells and amniotic membrane transplants in Italy, and contributing to the spread of lamellar corneal transplants (DALK, DSAEK, DMEK).

Despite the incredible evolution of diagnosis and treatment of corneal diseases, corneal blindness in the world remains a vast issue. All these new surgical techniques have not yet landed in most of the nations, even in the economically advanced ones. The number of needed surgeries and tissues is estimated to be about 70 times greater than the current one.

S.I.C.S.S.O. has a very ambitious project and its new Mission "Cornea Transplant Foundation for Developing Countries" will be presented in detail during the Medal Lectures session on Friday at 12.15 p.m., in the Main Room.

In conclusion, a lot of news!

How to reach Capaccio-Paestum

- **BY TRAIN:** High Speed line of 2 train company: Trenitalia and Italo. There are direct trains from:
Milan (Frecciarossa train or Italo train – 4 h),
Rome (Frecciarossa or Frecciabianca train or Italo train – 1.30 h),
Naples (Frecciarossa train or Italo train – 30 min).
Once in Salerno, a shuttle service will be available for congress participants to reach the meeting venue in Capaccio-Paestum. The shuttles schedule will match the arrival of each high speed train.
Alternatively, the **taxis** station is located outside the train station (089757575).
- **BY CAR:** Drive along the A1 highway, take Battipaglia exit if you arrive from the North or the Eboli exit if you arrive from the South, and then follow the regional way 18 for 5 km and take the Paestum exit.
- **BY PLANE:** The suggested airports are: Salerno Ponte Cagnano, Naples Capodichino and Rome Fiumicino.



- A bus service connects the airport of **Naples Capodichino** with the central train station of Naples (Stazione Napoli Centrale - Piazza Garibaldi) where high speed trains to Salerno are available.
- A train service (Leonardo Express) connects the airport of **Rome Fiumicino** with the central train station of Rome (Roma Termini) where high speed trains to Salerno are available.







KATHRYN A. COLBY (USA)

"Rethinking Fuchs Dystrophy in the Era of Successful Descemet Stripping"



Kathryn Colby, MD, PhD, is an internationally renowned ophthalmologist with expertise in managing complex medical and surgical diseases of the cornea and ocular surface. Dr. Colby has a particular interest in Fuchs' dystrophy, the most common cause for corneal transplantation in the United States, and is currently pioneering novel treatments for this condition. In addition, she has specific expertise in the management of ocular surface tumors, including conjunctival melanoma and squamous cell carcinoma. She was the founding director of the Pediatric Cornea service at the Boston Children's Hospital and has recently published the first book devoted to pediatric corneal disease.

Dr. Colby is an active researcher whose contributions have enhanced outcomes for patients who require keratoprosthesis (artificial cornea) surgery. She has an ongoing interest in corneal infections and has published extensively in this area. Dr. Colby was instrumental in determining the optimal surgical techniques for placement of the implantable miniature telescope, a vision-rehabilitative device for patients with macular degeneration.

Dr. Colby is a passionate educator who trained hundreds of medical students, ophthalmology residents and cornea fellows during the two decades she spent at Harvard Medical School prior to joining the University of Chicago to lead the Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Science as Chair. She currently holds the Louis Block Professorship at the University

of Chicago. Dr. Colby lectures around the world on numerous corneal and clinical research topics. She has leadership roles in various national and international societies, including the American Academy of Ophthalmology and the Cornea Society. She is the recipient of multiple awards, including the Senior Achievement award and two Secretariat awards from the AAO, and a mentorship award from the AMA.

"The Evolution of the Corneal Triple Procedure: A 3-Decade Journey"



Sadeer B. Hannush M.D. is Attending Surgeon on the Cornea Service at Wills Eye Hospital, Department of Ophthalmology at Sidney Kimmel Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He earned his Doctor of Medicine degree from Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan, and completed his Ophthalmology Residency at George Washington University in Washington, D.C. He then went on to fellowship training in Corneal and Refractive Surgery at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. Dr. Hannush's areas of interest are full and partial thickness corneal transplantation (endothelial and deep anterior lamellar keratoplasty), permanent keratoprosthesis surgery (artificial cornea), complex cataract and anterior segment reconstructive procedures, and laser vision correction. He lectures nationally and internationally on these topics (including Canada, Mexico, Brazil, Colombia, the United Kingdom, France, Denmark, the Netherlands, Austria, Spain, Italy, Egypt, South Africa, Kenya, Lebanon, the United Arab Emirates, Singapore, South Korea, and Australia). He has multiple publications in the peer-reviewed literature and chapters in ophthalmology texts. Dr. Hannush is a Fellow of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, Diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology, and a Member of the American Medical Association, the Cornea Society (where he served as Program Chair for four years), the Ocular Microbiology and Immunology Group, the International Society of Refractive Surgeons of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery, the

European Society of Corneal and Ocular Surface Specialists, and the European Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgeons. Dr. Hannush is the Medical Director of the Lions Eye Bank of Delaware Valley and an Advisory Board Member of the Eye Bank Association of America. He is a longstanding member of the Ophthalmic Drug Panel and a consultant to the Ophthalmic Devices Panel of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in Washington D.C. In 1995 he served on the FDA panel that approved the excimer laser and two liquid fluorocarbons. For the past twenty-five years Dr. Hannush has been chosen to teach at the American Academy of Ophthalmology, the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery, the European Society of Corneal and Ocular Surface Surgeons, and the European Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgeons annual meetings on the subjects of corneal transplantation, keratoprosthesis surgery, intraocular lens management and laser vision correction involving top national and international experts in these fields. Most of these courses describe pioneering surgical techniques that have been adopted throughout the world. Dr. Hannush has performed and taught corneal transplantation in Italy, Spain, Egypt and Kenya. He started a corneal transplantation program at Tenwek Mission Hospital in Western Kenya. He was one of the originators of W.I.R.E. (Wills International Resident Experience), during which the Wills Eye Hospital senior residents spend time abroad experiencing the delivery of ophthalmic care in a third world setting. Dr. Hannush has been named in 'The Best Doctors in Philadelphia' as well as 'The Best Doctors in The United States'. In 1998 he received the American Academy of Ophthalmology's Honor Award for distinguished service in education. At the 2008 American Academy of Ophthalmology Meeting he received the Senior Achievement Award. The Wills Eye Hospital resident class of 2000 presented him with the Excellence in Teaching Award.

There are over 10 million people worldwide living with treatable blindness. However, the current number of keratoplasties should grow 70 times to meet the number of those who are in need.

The newest lamellar keratoplasty surgical techniques may consent to improve the pool of donor tissues; in fact one donor cornea can be used for more than one recipient. One donor cornea can provide one DALK graft, one DMEK graft, and even a KLAL or scleral patch graft.

Furthermore, lamellar keratoplasties have a better prognosis than traditional PK. Lamellar keratoplasties have a significant lower incidence of rejection, higher and longer graft survival, and less intraoperative and postoperative complications.

Despite PK is becoming an uncommon procedure in advanced corneal centers, this traditional keratoplasty is still the most adopted procedure in the world, even in industrialized countries. When transitioning from PK to lamellar techniques, most of corneal surgeons have to face a tough learning curve without mentors who could help in overcoming the difficulties of these new techniques.

For all these reasons, S.I.C.S.S.O. (the International Society of Cornea Stem Cells and Ocular Surface) will have a new “mission”: the “Cornea Transplant Foundation for developing countries”.

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
