




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## PRESENTAZIONE DEL CONGRESSO

*Torino, una delle più belle città d'Italia, ospiterà il XVIII congresso S.I.C.S.S.O.. Il titolo della passata edizione, "Let's discuss again... clinical cases", passa il testimone ad una edizione congressuale più improntata sulla chirurgia. **Più di quindici interventi chirurgici**, direttamente dalle sale dell'Ospedale Oftalmico di Torino, caratterizzeranno il congresso di quest'anno. Articolata è la selezione dei casi con molte **DMEK** ovviamente, ma anche **DALK** e chirurgia della superficie con **TRAPIANTI DI LIMBUS**, **INNESTI DI MEMBRANA AMNIOTICA** ecc.. Particolare sarà la sessione di **Oculoplastica e Superficie Oculare** con interventi in diretta di complessi casi di maleocclusione palpebrale. Non mancheranno le sessioni di visita in diretta dei malati complessi né la gettonatissima, e riprodotta in altri congressi, wet lab su tessuti di banca.*

*La necessità di convergere sulle diagnosi, e quindi sulle conseguenti terapie, è sempre il problema più vivo in tema di "cornea e superficie oculare". Le infezioni corneali, patologie dai risvolti a volte drammatici, restano un argomento clou del congresso. Quest'anno in particolare, cercheremo di puntualizzare, oltre ai criteri diagnostici e terapeutici, gli aspetti della profilassi alla luce dei nuovi antisettici e dell'aumento delle resistenze agli antibiotici.*

*Riuscire ad avere comportamenti consoni e condivisi resta sempre un obiettivo da raggiungere. I Corsi in Italiano, con limitato numero di partecipanti (50*

persone), per approfondire meglio e chiarire dubbi su vari temi che nella Sala Plenaria non avrebbero adeguato spazio. Le **Medal Lectures** di quest'anno sono state assegnate a due amici internazionali S.I.C.S.S.O. di lunga data: **Marian Macsai ed Elmer Tu**, colleghi straordinari. Il loro contributo alle innovazioni nel nostro settore è da sempre un punto di riferimento nella nostra comunità.

Verranno premiati quattro partecipanti “**under 40**” per **Best Oral Presentation, Best Poster, Most Original Oral Presentation e Most Original Poster**.

Verrà inoltre assegnato il premio **Best Video**.

Verranno presentati i primi obiettivi raggiunti dalle “**Missioni**” di **S.I.C.S.S.O. Cornea Transplant Foundation for Developing Countries**, conseguenti al cambio di statuto dello scorso anno, al fine di assistere le curve di apprendimento nella chirurgia lamellare di chirurghi che ne hanno fatto richiesta nel mondo. Nonostante l'incredibile evoluzione nella diagnosi e nel trattamento delle patologie corneali, la cecità corneale nel mondo resta un problema immenso, e nella maggior parte delle nazioni, anche economicamente evolute, tutte le nuove tecniche chirurgiche lamellari non hanno ancora adeguato utilizzo. Il fabbisogno di trapianti necessita di un incremento di 70 volte. Noi di S.I.C.S.S.O. lavoreremo per questo.

## CONGRESS PRESENTATION

*The XVIII edition of S.I.C.S.S.O. meeting will be held in Turin, one of the most beautiful city in Italy, on June 27<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup>, 2019.*

*The previous edition entitled "Let's discuss again ... clinical cases" passes the torch to a new edition more focused on corneal surgery. **More than fifteen surgeries live streamed** from Turin's Ophthalmic Hospital will characterize the congress this year. The surgical cases selected are diversified and will include numerous **DMEK** and **DALK**, but also **AMNIOTIC MEMBRANE TRANSPLANTATION**, **LIMBAL TRANSPLANT**, **PTERYGIUM**, etc. Moreover, this year there will be a session entitled "**Oculoplasty & Ocular Surface**" that will be focused on eyelid malocclusion and its role in ocular surface diseases through live patients evaluation and live surgeries.*

*Traditional live patient evaluation of complex corneal cases and the most popular wet lab on eye bank tissues are included in the program.*

*The need to converge on diagnosis, and therefore on therapies, is always the most vivid problem in terms of cornea and ocular surface diseases. Corneal infections, pathologies with sometimes-dramatic consequences, remain a key topic of the meeting. This year in particular we will discuss about prophylaxis in light of new antiseptics and the increased antibiotics resistance. Our goal is to find consistent and shared behaviors.*

*Basic Courses in Italian language only, to better discuss about various topics*



*that wouldn't have had enough space in the plenary sessions, are renewed. Participation is limited (maximum 50 participants).*

*The 2019 Medal Lectures have been assigned to two long lasting S.I.C.S.S.O. international friends, who are extraordinary colleagues: **Marian Macsai** and **Elmer Tu**. Their contribution to innovations in our field has always been a point of reference in our community.*

*Four "**under 40**" participants will be awarded for the **Best Oral Presentation**, the **Best Poster**, the **Most Original Oral Presentation**, and the **Most Original Poster**. Moreover, the most voted video will be awarded with the **Best Video** prize.*

*The first results achieved by the "**S.I.C.S.S.O. MISSION**" will be presented. Last year S.I.C.S.S.O. changed its bylaws and developed a new project that aims to assist cornea specialists during their learning curves in lamellar surgeries worldwide. Despite the incredible evolution in diagnosis and treatment of corneal diseases, corneal blindness remains a huge problem in the world and the current number of keratoplasties should grow 70 times to meet the number of those who are in need.*

*The newest lamellar surgical techniques are still an uncommon procedure, even in industrialized country. S.I.C.S.S.O. will work to change this.*

*Wish you a good congress in Turin!*

**BEST POSTER:** S.I.C.S.S.O. is pleased to confirm and renew the cooperation with **Instituto Microcirugía Ocular – IMO of Barcelona**. A 1-2 weeks observership is the award for the presenter of the best poster. S.I.C.S.S.O. will give a grant of 1000 euros to the winner to support travel and stay expenses.

**MOST ORIGINAL ORAL PRESENTATION:** The winner will have the opportunity to be an observer for 1 week at **Clinica degli Occhi Sarnicola of Grosseto** (Italy) to focus on lamellar keratoplasty techniques, and will receive a grant of 500 euros to support travel and accommodation expenses.

**MOST ORIGINAL POSTER:** The winner will be awarded with a copy of the book **“Cornea”**, Elsevier.

**RULES AND CONDITIONS:** The awards will be assigned by an International Committee. Exposure in ENGLISH language is required. **Candidates for the awards must be registered at the congress. ## MARIAN S. MACSAI (USA)



*Medal Lecture 2019*

### "Eye banking and new corneal surgeries, what we have and what we need"

Dr. Macsai is the chief of the Division of Ophthalmology for NorthShore University HealthSystem and clinical professor of ophthalmology at the University of Chicago, Pritzker School of Medicine. She is the past President of the Cornea Society as well as past Chair of the Eye Bank Association of America. She has been active in eye banking at the national level for over 20 years.

Dr. Macsai is a board-certified ophthalmologist with fellowship training in cornea and refractive surgery. Her areas of specialties include corneal transplants, refractive surgery, cataracts, as well as medical and surgical treatment of diseases of the external eye. Dr. Macsai is a member of the American Ophthalmologic Society with thesis and serves as an examiner for the American Board of Ophthalmology. She has served on the Food and Drug Administration Ophthalmic Devices Panel and currently serves on the Advisory Committee on Blood and Tissue Safety and Availability (ACBTSA) as well as serving on the World Health Organization Biovigilance and Surveillance Committee.

She is nationally recognized as an expert in the fields of refractive and corneal surgery and has served as a guest speaker and visiting professor at numerous academic institutions, both in the United States and Internationally.

She has been the recipient of numerous honors and awards including the Paton Award, Distinguished Contributions in Medicine Award, and other outstanding teaching and education awards. She was Eversight's Gift of Sight Honoree in 2016. In 2017, she received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Academy of Ophthalmology.

She serves on the executive editorial board of the journal *Cornea*, and has edited the textbooks series *Rapid Diagnosis in Ophthalmology* and *Ophthalmic Microsurgical Suturing Techniques*. Most recently her article, *The use of Topical Rho kinase Inhibitors in the Treatment of Fuchs Dystrophy after Descemets Stripping* Only is in publication.

### "Prevention and management of corneal transplant – related infections"

Elmer Y. Tu, MD is a Professor of Clinical Ophthalmology and Director of the Cornea and External Disease Section of the Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences, University of Illinois College of Medicine, Chicago, Illinois. He received a BS in Chemistry from the University of Miami in 1984 and an MD from the University of Miami School Of Medicine in 1988. He completed an Ophthalmology residency at the University of Wisconsin, Madison in 1992 and a fellowship in Cornea and External Disease at the Bascom Palmer Eye Institute in 1993. He was formerly Director of the Corneal and External Disease Section, Department of Ophthalmology, University of Texas Health Science Center- San Antonio, San Antonio, Texas until 1999 and served as Residency Program Director. His areas of research interest involve infectious and inflammatory diseases of the ocular surface, contact lens safety, corneal surgery and eye banking.


Dr. Tu is a recipient of both an American Academy of Ophthalmology Achievement Award and 2 Secretariat Awards. He was elected to the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Society and has been listed an expert consultant to the FDA Ophthalmic Devices Panel. He serves on the AUPO Fellowship Compliance Committee and previously served on the American Academy of Ophthalmology Basic and Clinical Science Course Cornea/External Disease Subcommittee and Knowledge Base-Cornea/External Disease-Panel Subcommittee. He currently serves as President of the Cornea Society and is a past President of the Ocular Microbiology and Immunology Group. He is an Executive Editor for Cornea and External Diseases for the American Journal of Ophthalmology, served as a Section Editor of the AAO publication, Focal Points, and is a member of the Editorial Board of the subspecialty journals Cornea and Eye and Contact Lens. He performs peer review on a regular basis for numerous national and international journals. He has also received numerous teaching awards, presented numerous national, named and international invited lectures and has been listed as a Best Doctor in America for over 15 years. In total, he has over 100 book chapters, peer-reviewed manuscripts, and abstracts in publication.

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There are over 10 million people worldwide living with treatable blindness. However, the current number of keratoplasties should grow 70 times to meet the number of those who are in need.

The newest lamellar keratoplasty surgical techniques may consent to improve the pool of donor tissues; in fact one donor cornea can be used for more than one recipient. One donor cornea can provide one DALK graft , one DMEK graft, and even a KLAL or scleral patch graft. Furthermore, lamellar keratoplasties have a better prognosis than traditional PK. Lamellar keratoplasties have a significant lower incidence of rejection, higher and longer graft survival, and less intraoperative and postoperative complications.

Despite PK is becoming an uncommon procedure in advanced corneal centers, this traditional keratoplasty is still the most adopted procedure in the world, even in industrialized countries. When transitioning from PK to lamellar techniques, most of corneal surgeons have to face a tough learning curve without mentors who could help in overcoming the difficulties of these new techniques. For all these reasons, S.I.C.S.S.O., the International Society of Cornea, Stem Cell and Ocular Surface, has started, in 2018, a new activity called CORNEA TRASPLANT FOUNDATION FOR DEVELOPING COUNTRIES, in order to transmit, with tutoring and mentoring missions, the newest lamellar keratoplasty surgical techniques.

An International Board has been nominated to coordinate the “**CORNEA TRANSPLANT FOUNDATION**” activities. In six months three missions were successfully completed in Turkey, Georgia and Italy.

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
