CONGRESS PRESENTATION

Welcome to the **XXII S.I.C.S.S.O Congress** being held in **Grosseto**, in the enchanting **Tuscany** region, on **June 27th - 29th 2024**.

This will be a particularly special meeting as our headquarters are in Grosseto. We are very proud of the continuously growing international attendance. While we have received an extremely high number of submissions from 44 different countries, we regret we were not able to accept them all. **All the sessions in the Main Room will be held in English**. There will still be simultaneous English-Italian translation available for those attendees who may need it.

Dua** from Nottingham (UK). There will also be a new award, the **Lifetime Career Achievement Award**, that will be assigned to two pillars of our scientific community that have helped to improve, shape, rewrite, and spread the modern knowledge about cornea and external disease: Prof. **Edward J. Holland** from Cincinnati (USA) and Prof. **Mark J. Mannis** from Sacramento (USA).



How to reach the congress venue



By Plane

The nearest airports to Grosseto are those in Pisa (155 km), Florence (150 km) and Rome (170 km).

From Pisa Airport

Once you exit the airport, follow the signs for "Pisamover Shuttle" by walking along the long covered corridor.

The shuttle connects Pisa airport with the main Pisa railway station (Pisa Centrale). The shuttle is in service every day from 6:00 a.m. to midnight with variable frequencies depending on the number of passengers.

A single ticket costs 5€.

Once in Pisa Centrale, you can take direct fast train to Grosseto.

Travel time from Pisa to Grosseto is approximately 60/90 minutes.

From Rome Fiumicino Airport

Rome Fiumicino Airport (FCO) is connected to main railway station "Roma Termini" by the Leonardo Express train, which departs every 15-20 minutes (€14.00 – 32 minutes travel time). The Leonardo Express train departs and arrives at Terminal 3 (international departures).

From "Roma Termini", you can take a train that takes about 2 hours to reach Grosseto station.

Rome Fiumicino Airport is also connected to Grosseto train station through a direct bus shuttle service that departs from the "arrivals" area of Terminal 3.

The service operates two trips:

- Departure at 10:45 AM with arrival in Grosseto at 12:50 PM.

- Departure at 7:30 PM with arrival in Grosseto at 09:35 PM.

From Florence Airport

Walk to the bus station by heading southeast towards Via del Termine (90m - 2min) and take the urban Tram T2 towards Florence, which runs every 7 minutes (€2). Get off at the "Alamanni – Stazione Firenze" stop and continue walking to Santa Maria Novella train station, which is approximately 250m away.

From here, you can continue to Grosseto by train or by bus.

Bus service is faster than train.

Travel time from Firenze S. M. Novella to Grosseto is approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes.

To book a bus ticket, download the app "Autolinee Toscane" and enter extra-urban route "Florence - Grosseto".

Once in Grosseto

Once in Grosseto train/bus station, the conference center can be reached by bus by purchasing tickets at the newsstand inside the train station, or using **S.I.C.S.S.O. bus service** (time and schedules will be published soon).

The local buses that go to the conference center are 1/G, G10, or G12.

The convention center stop is named "Principina Terra".

Badge





HARMINDER S. DUA (UK)

Short biography

Harminder Singh Dua, MD

CBE, CMLJ, DL MBBS, DO, DO(London), MS, MNAMS, FRCS(Edinburgh), FEBO, FRCOphth, FRCP(Edinburgh, Hon.), FCOptom.(Hon.), FRCOphth.(Hon.), FAICO (India, Hon.), MD, PhD, is Chair and Professor of Ophthalmology at the Queens Medical Centre, University of Nottingham since 1994, Consultant Ophthalmologist, Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust and Honorary Professor of Universita della Svizze, Lugano, since 2010.

He was made Commander of the most excellent order of the British Empire by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in her 2019 Birthday Honours list and served a full term as the High Sheriff of Nottinghamshire (2021-22). He was recently awarded the NHS Parliamentary Lifetime Achievement award for the Midlands, Commissioned as a Deputy Lieutenant in the Lieutenancy of Nottinghamshire and awarded the high rank of Commander of Merit of the Military and Hospitaller order of Saint Lazarus of Jerusalem.

He was the Master of the Oxford Ophthalmological Congress (2019-2020), President of several international organisations namely, Royal College of Ophthalmologists UK (2011-14), of EuCornea (2011-13), of the European association for vision and eye research (EVER, 2008), and of the EVER Foundation (2010-14 and 2016-2020). He was Editor in chief of the BJO (2007-14) and EuCornea Journal (2015-22).

Among his over 150 awards and accolades are the Rotary Foundation Global Alumni Service to Humanity Award (2013), The Times Higher Education Award 2014 for 'Research project of the year' and the Melvin Jones Fellow (Award) Lions Clubs International Foundation for humanitarian work. He has been endowed with Honorary Fellowships of the Royal College of Ophthalmologists UK, the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh, the College of Optometrists UK, and the Collegium of the All India Ophthalmological Society; the highest accolades conferred by the respective Colleges. One eponymous lecture, "The Dua Lecture" Birmingham, and a seminar room in the Nottingham post-graduate centre, "The Dua Room" are named in his honour.

He has supervised 55 PhD/MPhil students, has over 450 peer reviewed publications with over 27500 citations and an H-index of 79. His discovery of the pre-Descemet's layer (Dua's layer) in 2013, in the human cornea has had considerable impact on lamellar corneal surgery and corneal pathology.



EDWARD J. HOLLAND (USA)

Short biography

Edward J. Holland, MD

is the Director of Cornea Services at Cincinnati Eye Institute and Professor of Ophthalmology at the University of Cincinnati. He attended the Loyola-Stritch School of Medicine in Chicago and trained in Ophthalmology at the University of Minnesota.

He completed a fellowship in cornea and external disease at the University of Iowa, and then completed a second fellowship in ocular immunology at the National Eye Institute, National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Maryland. He returned to serve as Director of Cornea and Refractive Surgery Service at the University of Minnesota. He was promoted to the position of Professor and was granted the Elias Potter Lyon Chair in Ophthalmology. He also served as President of the Minnesota Academy of Ophthalmology. Dr. Holland formerly served as the President for the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery from 2011-2012 and served as the Program Chair for 12 years. Dr. Holland was a former member of the Board of Trustees for the American Academy of Ophthalmology. He has also served on numerous committees and as the Secretariat of the Annual Meeting for the American Academy of Ophthalmology. Dr. Holland has served as the Chair of the Eye Bank Association and was the former Chair of the Medical Advisory Board as well as a longtime member of the Board of Directors. He is the past President of the Cornea Society and previously served many years on its Board of Directors. Dr. Holland has received numerous national and international awards including the Castroviejo Award from the Cornea Society. He has received both the Honor Award, Senior Achievement Award and Life Achievement Honor Award from the American Academy of Ophthalmology. He was awarded the Binkhorst Medal and the Lindstrom Medal by the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery. He was a recipient of the Paton Society Award given by the Eye Bank Association of America. Dr. Holland was awarded the Asian Cornea Foundation Medal of Honor. Dr. Holland has published extensively in both basic and clinical research and is the author of 336 articles in peer review journals. Dr. Holland was the co-principal investigator of the Cornea Donor Study, the largest clinical trial conducted in the field of cornea. He has co-edited five editions of Cornea, the most widely read textbook on corneal disease and surgery.

Dr. Holland serves as an ex officio member of the Holland Foundation for Sight Restoration. This organization's vision is "To ensure those suffering from corneal blindness have access to life-changing treatments and lifetime follow-up care" and its mission is "To establish 'Centers of Excellence' that will provide patient access and sustainability of care for the treatment of corneal blindness."



MARK J. MANNIS (USA)

Short biography

Mark J. Mannis, M.D., F.A.C.S.

is the Fosse Endowed Chair in Vision Science Research, Professor and Chair of the Department of Ophthalmology & Vision Science, and Director of the Ernest E. Tschannen Eye Institute at the University of California, Davis. He also serves as Co-Medical Director of Sierra Donor Services in Sacramento, California. He completed his ophthalmology residency training at Washington University in St. Louis and a fellowship in Cornea and External disease at the University of Iowa. His primary research includes studies in the development of new anti-infective agents, corneal transplantation, visual rehabilitation of patients with corneal disease, and the management of oculodermal disease and diseases of the ocular surface. Clinically, he specializes in corneal surgery and diseases of the external eye. Dr. Mannis is editor/ author of six books: Cornea –published by Elsevier—a two volume comprehensive text on the cornea and external eye co-edited with Jay Krachmer and Edward Holland, and cited as one of the 100 most important texts in ophthalmology of the 20th century, currently in its 5th Edition; Eye and Skin Disease - a text for both ophthalmologists and dermatologists on skin diseases with ocular manifestations, co-edited with Marian Macsai and Arthur Huntley; Corneal Transplantation: A History in Profiles - co-authored and co-edited with Avi Mannis; Ocular Surface Disease co-authored with Edward Holland; Ocular Surface Disease: Cornea, Conjunctiva and Tear Film co-authored with Edward Holland and W. Barry Lee, and Contact Lenses in Ophthalmic Practice, a manual on contact lenses, translated and edited by Dr. Mannis. Dr. Mannis was Editor-in-Chief of the journal Cornea and founding editor of Vision Pan-America: The Pan-American Journal of Ophthalmology. He has published widely in peer-reviewed journals with over 200 published papers and is a reviewer for the Archives of Ophthalmology, Cornea, the American Journal of Ophthalmology, Ophthalmology, and Cornea and Contact Lenses. Dr. Mannis is a recipient of the R. Townley Paton Award in eye banking from the Eye Bank Association of America and was a recipient of the Lew Wasserman Award in research from Research to Prevent Blindness, Inc. for his work in the development of antimicrobial peptides in ophthalmology. He has received the Moacyr Alvaro Gold Medal from the Federal University of Sao Paulo for contributions to ophthalmic education in Latin America and has received an honorary doctorate from the University of San Marcos in Lima, Peru. He was the 2014 recipient of the Castroviejo Medal for his lifetime contributions to the subspecialty of cornea and both the Claes Dohlman Award from the Cornea Society and the EnergEyes award from the American Academy of Ophthalmology for his mentorship and teaching accomplishments. He has served as one of the Directors of the American Board of Ophthalmology and is President Emeritus of the Cornea Society as well as the Pan-American Association of Ophthalmology. He conducts a busy referral practice in diseases of the cornea and external eye based at the University of California, Davis.


